Over the Pastor's Shoulder

Time marches on. I have a hunch that is no surprise to any of you who read the Crier each month. Whatever we are involved in, whatever we would like to do with our time, it is easy for things we want to do to slip by. Time marches on and its passage brings many challenges to be met. Here at Central Church we are aware of the passage of time as we look at our church building and at the congregation. The historic building we worship in is in need of major restoration, and the congregation as it ages is facing many issues as it faces the future.

To face the challenges of the future, the congregation has decided to take two major steps forward. One, knowing the current pastor retires next March, it decided at its last Quarterly Meeting to search for and call a full time pastor to lead it. The Pastoral Search Committee is well underway in its search and will be called on to report its progress at the next Quarterly Business Meeting. This is a most important step because whom the church calls will provide the tone for reaching out to attract others to join us here at Central. When he or she arrives, they will need the full support of each member of the congregation if it is to be an active congregation and grow in the future as God leads it. I encourage you to be constantly and fervently praying for the Search Committee and to offer what help you can to facilitate their task in the months to come.

The church's second decision in its efforts to face the future was to adopt a plan to ensure the historic building we worship in will continue far into its second century as the central landmark in the city of Galesburg, and an outpost of the love of God. The goal is to raise a significant amount of money to deal with the immediate needs to preserve the building and to establish an Endowment Fund to ensure resources will be available in the years to come to maintain it. A gathering of community leaders has been held and a consultant, Partners in Sacred Places, has been brought in to guide and help us. Later in August there will be Workshops held to assess the resources available and investigate possible use of the building. An article in this Crier outlines the initial steps being taken to meet the challenge

Time marches on. We have, as the poet said, much to do and "miles to go before we sleep," and there is only so much time to do what needs to be done. Please prayerfully consider how you can help Central move to the next stage of its life as a congregation. It can't happen with only a few of us. It will need many to "take the time" to make it happen. We need many to – carpe diem – to seize the day, if the future is to be bright. Will you join in the effort? If you do, you will be glad you did.

PARTNERS FOR SACRED PLACES

Building Preservation Update:

As many of you know, Central has recently started down the road that we hope will lead to the preservation of our beautiful building for generations to come. To help us determine whether the resources are available we have begun working with Partners for Sacred Places, a national organization that specializes in helping historically significant churches preserve their buildings. You can learn more about them by visiting their web site www.sacredplaces.org.

The first step has been for them to get a perspective of the church and wider community by way of interviews. This was done in early July. The next phase will occur August 22nd and 23 are the church. On Saturday from 9am to noon Partners will conduct an Asset-Mapping workshop to help us identify the strengths and assets in our Church and community. Lunch will be served from noon to 1pm. An afternoon session from 1pm to 3pm will be a brainstorming session for those interested in discussing specific uses of the building in a Space Sharing workshop. The goal will be to consider ways underutilized parts of the building can be used by our community.

Sunday, Partners will lead a training session on Capital Campaigns.

Broad participation by both Church and community members is critical for success so please consider attending some or all of these workshops.



With all the emphasis on raising money for an endowment fund and placing money in the Galesburg Community Foundation Preservation Fund, we cannot forget our monthly expenses. The middle of May there was insufficient funds in the cash flow account to make payroll and meet the monthly expenses. The Trustees had to borrow \$5,000 from the savings account. We were at the same situation for the middle of July and had to withdraw another \$5,000. Please remember our regular offering as our expenses continue to go on.

Church Preservation Now and in the Future

As most are aware, Central Church is planning a drive to raise significant money to preserve its historic building on the Square in Galesburg. It is a big undertaking, one which will need the help of many both within and outside the church. The goal for the drive is to raise in the neighborhood of nine million dollars, six to deal with the natural deterioration of an hundred plus year old building and another three for an Endowment Fund to maintain it in the future.

Preservation Fund

The money raised here will be used for specific projects to deal with current needs of the church. These include a new roof, a boiler to replace the relic currently keeping us warm, window stabilization to ensure they don't fall out in some future windstorm, organ maintenance to replace 100 year old leathers crucial to the sound of the instrument, plastering and painting the interior ceiling, bringing restrooms up to code, as well as reassessment of what can be done with the lower level to expand its use in the future.

Endowment Fund

An Endowment Fund is just as, if not more, important to the future of the church building than the Preservation Fund. An Endowment Fund provides ongoing income **EACH and EVERY year** to maintain the building, program its use, and take care of any deterioration as it happens instead of putting upkeep off requiring a future fund drive. An Endowment Fund of \$3,000,000 at the Galesburg Community Foundation would bring about \$140,000 per year for this purpose. Out of the generosity of the Foundation and a good friend of the church, \$20,000 has been provided as stimulus for us to match with an additional \$20,000 by June 30, 2016. With many thanks to the special donor and to the Foundation, this is a great start toward our goal.

Is the building on the Square known as Central Church something Galesburg would want to save? Is it a goal worth giving to, perhaps substantially, to make sure it remains on the Square and not demolished as some other historic buildings in town have been in recent years? There are many ways to do so. Gifts payable to the Galesburg Community Foundation with Central Church in the memo can be sent for either the Preservation or Endowment Fund. Current gifts to the Endowment Fund will match the money provided as seed money for our projects. Single gifts larger gifts pledged over a 3 to 5 year period, or perhaps a Charitable Gift large enough to insure a person's annual gift to the church will go on after they are gone, are possible ways to give. If you can help reach our goal, please do either by making a gift or call the church and set up a time to meet with church leadership to discuss how you might best help us move forward. To help kick start the project, the Pastor has pledged to give \$10 for the Fund for each of the first 20 people who let him know they read this article.


