Over the Pastor's Shoulder - Reflections on Reformation Sunday (from a sermon preached Oct. 25, 2015)

As we looked recently at the Reformation begun by Martin Luther in 1517, one thing that stuck out was that part of its cause was the church of that time had lost its vision of what God and Jesus called it to be. That fact should make us aware of the need for every church to have a vision of what it wants to become. This is especially true for us here at Central as we work to preserve our building as a symbol of the history of our town but more importantly as a center of the sharing of God's love with those in the community. The 16th century church lost its vision as it worked to build its church. We don't want that to happen here.

As a transition in pastoral leadership here at Central occurs in about three months, the most important issue it faces is not whether the building can be preserved or even whether everyone will like the new pastor. I believe the most important need in the life of Central Church today is for it to develop its vision of what God is calling it to be in the next 5-10 years. Proverbs 29:18 in the old King James Version says 'where there is no vision, the people perish." When people don't have an idea of where they want to go, in coming years not only will they never know when they get there, they will face away in the process.

For a variety of reasons, Central has struggled over the years focusing on a vision. One of the strengths of congregationalism is its members are free to have their own opinions about things theologically and how the church should function. One of the weaknesses of congregationalism is that its members are free to have their own opinions about things and not have to go along with anybody else's. As a result, decisions about what the whole church should be about are hard to make and then implement. It can be easy for people to be passive about decisions that are made and not get involved. The church can't survive much less grow, however, if things operate that way.

A common vision of where Central wants to be five to ten years from now is crucial to its existence. "Where there is no vision, the people perish." Every church needs a vision of where God wants it to go. If it doesn't pay attention to that, sooner or later it loses its way and eventually dies.

As Central moves into the next state of its life as a church, to successfully preserve the building we are in and prepare ourselves to welcome a new pastor in the new year the question for all of us is what is our vision for Central as a congregation of God's children? I urge you to be a part of the process in coming weeks as we look together for this congregation's, because if we do it together, we all will be glad we did.

It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas


